Once checked in, sign out a room key and swipe (if needed) and head back to the student worker space to review student information and prepare for your tour

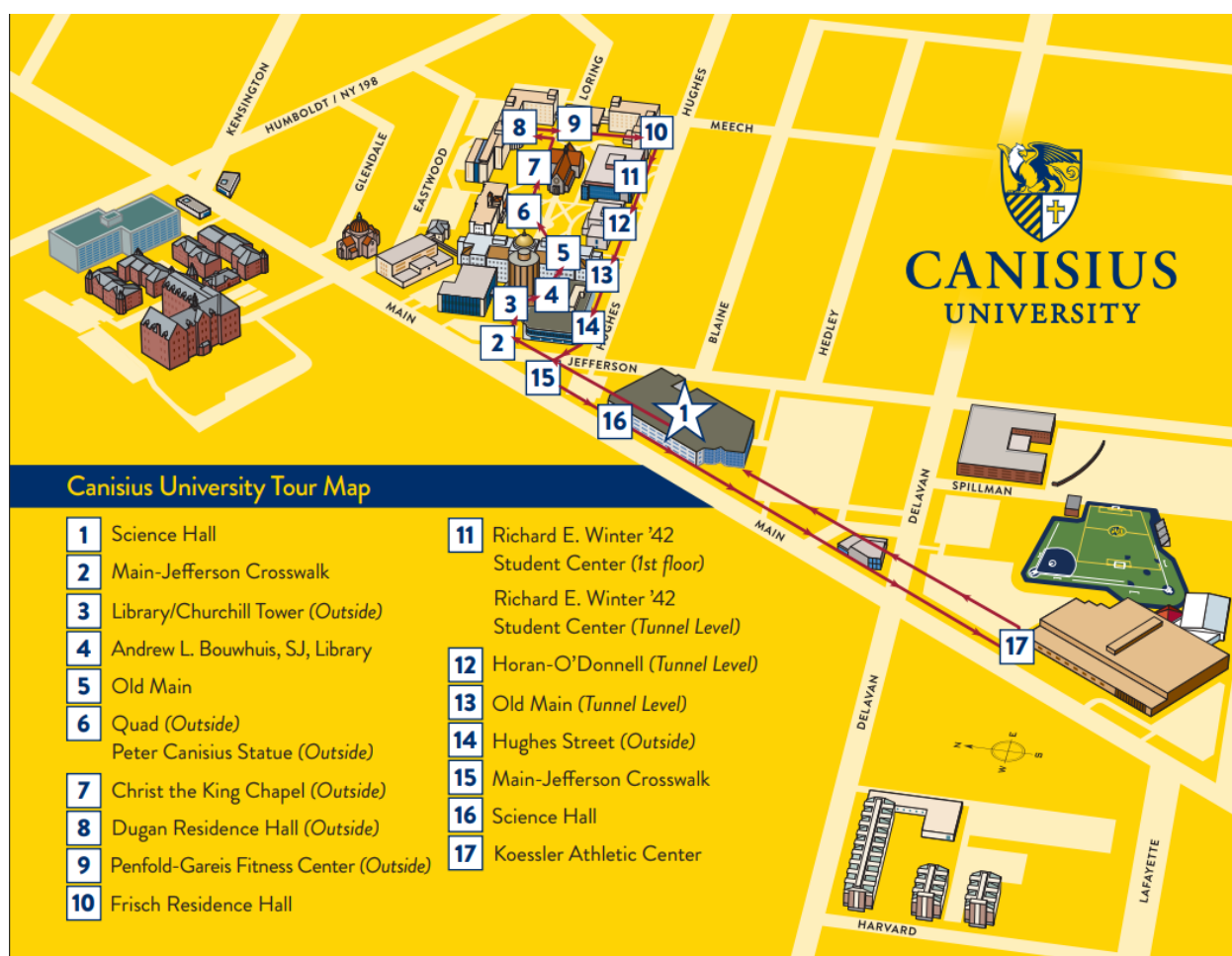

Tour Start:

Exit the elevator and take a left going towards the front of Science Hall

Science Hall Commons (Either first in science hall or last with the conclusion)

- Event space
- Students are able to study in here as well
- Mention Health Science across the street
- Classroom example
 - Small class sizes
 - Example of your own classroom (*Story telling*)
- Mention our cybersecurity Grad Lab.
 - Cybersecurity has their own WIFI network
- Mention our ESPN3 studio.
 - We broadcast all of our home games that take place at the Demske field and in the KAC gym from here.
 - This Internship is open to any major to have an opportunity to work with ESPN and broadcasting.
 - They have green screen room as well that they use for Post or Pre-game interviews.
 - There is facility offices and labs for the program
 - It is a great internship opportunity that is open to any major if a student is interested in getting into broadcasting and working with ESPN

REST OF SCIENCE HALL

Continue walking towards the back entrance.

- Points to talk about.
 - Physician Assistance (PA) program in the basement. (All Year Program)
Additional details can be tailored by an admissions counselor.
 - Live plant wall.

- Science Hall is home to Pre-Med programs.
- New programs in science hall – Anthro, ABEC (2nd floor of SH)

Unapologetic Café/ Robotic dinning (Costa and Just Baked)

Unapologetic is a community organization started by BPS Educators

- Mention the use of Griff bucks, however, will discuss the rest of the meal plan in the dining hall.
- Mailroom (Right side)
 - Residents only get a mailroom key and mailbox number can get packages sent and receive an email upon arrival.
 - Free for residents
- Animal Behavior Lab
 - Ghost screen but when opened you can see kittens and other animals on campus

Cross street at walkway in front of Science Hall (Jefferson)

- **Make sure to press the crosswalk button (Cars will not stop so ensure that your group is safe before proceeding)**

Cross Hughes and make your way up the walkway towards the library. (Jefferson)

- **Mention Hughes Houses and Blue lights**
- Private Housing - Housing option From alumni on Hughes and Blane
- Blue Light -blue-light telephones are located throughout the campus. Emergency phones are also located at the entrances to all dormitories. These can be used to report a criminal incident, fire or any other type of emergency.
- Emphasize safety: Dispatchers are on duty 24 hours a day to take your call and send campus safety Officers to investigate.

Stop in front of library doors (If it's super cold outside, you can go inside the library entrance and talk about it from that hallway before entering the library.)

 - Option for sophomore and upperclassmen housing
 - Apartment style living
 - Two/Three roommates, bathroom, kitchen, and living room

MAIN CAMPUS:

Turn and face Churchill Towers

- Churchill Towers is home to a majority of professor's offices

- Facility members are grouped by major and assessable everywhere on campus
- First 2 floors are classrooms
- This is where they hold their office hours.
- 10 stories high
- Because we offer such a small class size (Median 18), there are always office hours available with your professor (minimum 10 hours per week).

(Can walk forward or stay where you are depends on the size of the group)

To the left is Bagen Hall Bagen Hall is home to the President's office as well as the Deans of our schools and administration

Library:

Please walk INTO the library and go beyond the entrance. Take them on a little walk around the library.

- *This is the main floor where students come to spend time with their friends and do their classwork*
- *We have a lot of room for studying both up here and on our basement floor; which is our quiet floor and where most of our books are available to check out for free.*
- *We also have board games, phone and computer chargers, and even DVD players you can check out, too.*
- *We have study rooms on the basement floor and on the main floor that students can book ahead of time - they have screens, whiteboards, and are great for group work or if you just need a quiet place to work.*
- *Whenever you need help with anything, whether it's research, looking for books, or things not related to the library at all, the librarians are always willing to help you with whatever you need.*

Golisano Center for Student Success

Testing Center/Rooms (Left)

- Designated space for:
 - Testing accommodations related to accessibility
 - Make-up exams

Student Rooms (right)

At the end of the Hallway point out the international office and the ALANA Center

Highlight the **International Student Programs/Study Abroad Office**.

- Tuition, credits, and room/board all carry over for half of the location (24 Location Total)
- Programs for two weeks, a whole semester, and over the summer.

Honors students have separate study abroad opportunities and programs

ALANA (African American, Latino American, Asian American, & Native American) Student Center
Reference “ALANA SIGN”

- Provides African American, Latinx American, Asian American and Native American (ALANA) students with various services that help students to succeed at Canisius and after they graduate. They strive towards the campus community goals of fostering, respecting, and exploring cultural differences.
- Programs– ALANA orientation, soup with substance, cultural excursions

Student Accessibility Services (SAS)

- Provides accommodations and resources for students with disabilities (example 504 plan)
- Students with learning differences, including those who had an IEP (Individualized Education Plan) in high school, may continue receiving accommodations at Canisius
- We recommend that all students who have accommodation or think they need accommodation should contact SAS. You would rather have it and not utilize it then not have it at all.

- SAS does not conduct diagnostics students will have to provide proper documentation from a medical professional

- Each student is assigned a **Career Counselor**
- Career development can begin **as soon as a student arrives on campus**

- Tutors are students who have successfully completed the course
- Provides **work opportunities** for student tutors

Academic Mentoring Program

After entering Old Main, turn to walk towards the Golden Griffin Fund. While walking towards the Golden Griff fund Talk about Old Main

- Main Academic building on campus
 - Majority of our core classes take place here as well as business courses
 - Some student resources can be found here as well
 - First Floor: classroom and office spaces
 - Second Floor: Campus ministry and classrooms
 - Fourth Floor: Classrooms (Digital Media Arts Lab, 3D printer, Bloomberg computers + 1 In library)
- Mention Religious classes: Ensure them that this is versatile in what they can choose and is more like a history lesson on different religions. They might think they are being forced to prescribe to another religion.

- Investment Management ...
- For finance students who participate in the Golden Griffin Fund (investment management course)
- Won the Global CFA research competition in 2015, beat 850+ schools.
CFA Steps: Regional < National < Global
- Students follow different stocks and do research on them and then make a portfolio to present their findings and whether the college should invest or not

- The proposal from the competition is used to reinvest into the Golden fund (portfolio balance +\$870,000 and 2024 bring in +10 percent return on investment)

Move to New state-of-the-art “Hyflex” classroom space on 1st floor of Oldman

- New carpeting, ceilings, lighting, mobile furniture, whiteboards and advanced audiovisual equipment.
- The goal is to modernize all our academic spaces

Exit Old Main into the Quad

QUAD:

Stop after walking a few steps away from Old Main

To the left is Loyola Hall where our Jesuit Priests live

- Often Loyola hall host visiting priest VISITING buffalo area for work
- Host Refugee along with meal services
- *Explain what a Jesuit education means:* Founded by the Society of Jesus, Canisius espouses the principles of human excellence, care for the whole person, social justice and interreligious dialogue.

To the right is Horan O’Donnell

- The majority of chemistry classes take place here. Occasionally has core curriculum and business classes.
